On the 4<sup>th</sup> August 2012 a **Thresher shark** was caught and released by member Malcolm Roberts whilst out shark fishing on the boat Mystique 11 skipper Dave Bond. This is the first time since the 1960's that a large Thresher shark has been caught on rod & line on a boat from Looe. Had the Thresher shark been brought in and weighed we are sure that it would have been a new British record. Approximate weight 340lbs. Congratulations go to Malcolm & Dave for releasing such a magnificent shark.
