3rd Report—September 1954

The Committee propose the following Amendments, Alterations and Additions to the Rules, as under.

1. With reference to Rule 2 of the General Rules, Nominations are Required for the Committee for the coming year, immediately, in order to allow time to send the list of nominees to Members to admit of their voting by proxy, if they so desire, at the Annual General Meeting on the 16th October.

The Committee, at present, consists of seven Members, but may consist of eight. It is pointed out that Committee Meetings take place fairly frequently so that, in the interest of the Club, it would be unwise to put on the Committee, Members who cannot, or would not, wish to attend these Meetings.

Will Members, therefore, please send in nominations as soon as possible—to arrive not later than 1st October—and state against each nomination whether or not the Member nominated is willing and able to serve.

2. In accordance with Rule 3 of the General Rules the Committee nominate F. A. Mitchell-Hedges, Esq., as President for the ensuing Year.

3. Rule 3 of the General Rules. The Words "and a Chairman" shall be deleted and that Rule 3A shall be added, thus—"The Chairman shall be elected by the Committee."

4. Rule 15. The following amendment shall be made "for the full stop at end of para. insert comma, and add, "and removed daily when the Member leaves the boat."

The following Ruling for Competition purposes has been given by the Committee of the Shark Angling Club of Great Brit

“That the British Record for any species of Shark shall be that Record existing at the end of the Shark Angling Club's Year (i.e. 2 days before the Annual General Meeting).”

and, of course, the new British Record Fish landed by Mr. V. F. Barlow of 155 lbs. Of these three, only Mr. Robinson was a Member of the Club at the time of capture and, of course, the other fish are not eligible for the Club's Trophies except the Qualifying Cup. Both Major Roberts and Mr. Barlow have since become Members.
