# SHARK ANGLING CLUB OF GREAT BRITAIN

# FINAL REPORT FOR 1954-55

At the end of the Club's year, there were 187 members, of whom over 80 qualified for membership this year. (The raising of the qualifying weight to 75 lb. obviously did not deter those who had set their minds on becoming members.)

One thousand, one hundred and fifty sharks were recorded in the season. Amongst these were Mrs. Hetty Eathorne's magnificent porbeage of 352 lb. (the Club has taken steps to try and claim this as a British record); Mr. H. Whiddett's British record-breaking "blue" of 180 lb., for which he also won the "Le Guillon" Prize Reel. The 1953 British record for "blues," 122 lb., was beaten no less than seven times by: R. Daniel 131 lb., R. C. Hiam 130 lb., Dr. Hales 124 lb., G. E. Shaw 138 lb., Mrs. Eathorne 132½ lb., T. Penton 124 lb.; and, of course, H. Whiddett 180 lb.

It is certain that several hundred sharks were landed at Looe this season which through various reasons were not declared. It would be reasonable to estimate the total number of sharks caught at Looe this season as being in the region of 1,400. This is a lot of "shark," and we wonder what will happen in the coming season.

### CLUB RULE BOOK

As promised, a new Rule Book in a detachable folder was produced and issued to all members. It is felt that except ig for the occasional loop hole that might be brought to light by something unusual occurring, the Club's rules are very sound and fair.

The Club approached the White Fish Authority re the commercial use of sharks; they said that, although there was no use at the moment, they had it under consideration.

Plenty of publicity has been given to Shark Angling, and what with television, newspapers and magazines, the S.A.C.G.B. has certainly made itself known throughout the country.

### BRITISH RECORDS

As previously stated, an effort has been made to clarify the position of whether or not fish caught in Southern Ireland stand as British Records. The Club drafted a letter to all the fishing magazines and, what with a movement already afoot by certain people, it might well be that these fish caught in Southern Ireland since 1922 will not be eligible for British records. It might be then that Mrs. Eathorne's 352 lb. Porbeagle and Mr. Whiddett's 180 lb. Blue Shark will give the S.A.C.G.B. both British records.

### **CLUB BADGES**

Many members have already purchased the Club's official car badge, lapel badges and tie pins. What with the Club blazer, badge and tie, we hope that members will make themselves known in various towns, etc., by seeing these badges on other members, they probably have not already met.

### CLUB HEADQUARTERS

It has been decided to move the H.Q. into the centre of Looe, nearer the boats, and the Club has been fortunate in obtaining the Salutation Inn for its H.Q. This has always been the unofficial H.Q., and most members eventually find their way there during the course of their stay in Looe. (More big sharks have been "On" and got away in the "Sal" than anywhere in Great Britain!) With an excellent committee room upstairs, which members can use during the summer months for a quiet drink and talk, it is felt that having the H.Q. close to the boats will soon prove an asset.

### SUBSCRIPTIONS, 1956

The Club has adopted the "Banker's Order" system, and these forms will be made available to members. Again it is felt that many will prefer to pay this way. Of course members can, as in the past, just send along their cheque if they wish.
