Up and to the 3rd August, 1957, 90 new members qualified for membership, a very fine start to the Season and an indication of the growing popularity of Shark Angling in Gt. Britain.

In the above list it is to be noted that a Mrs. Flynn of London landed a Blue of 138 lbs., this is a new unofficial British Record for Ladies, the previous record being 134½ lbs. by Mrs. D. Case of Looe. Steps have been taken to get this fish officially recognised as a British Record.

Also Mr. A. M. Simpson's "Blue" of 161½ lbs. which came very close to the British Record of 180 lbs., this fish might well earn Mr. Simpson several trophies when same are allocated at the end of the Season.

The Club has generally been running along quietly and smoothly, with very little to report on meetings, etc. Since the Annual General Meeting in October 1956, there has been 4 Committee Meetings, the following main points were dealt with; at the first of these meetings on Nov. 24th, 1956 the Committee elected Brig. J. A. L. Caunter, C.B.E., M.C., to be Chairman for a further twelve months and Mr. S. Oliver of Yeovil as Vice-Chairman.

It was decided by the Committee that the Annual Dinner and Prizegiving would be held at the Nailzee Point Hotel, Looe, for this coming year, the date being the 18th October, 1957. Members will be well advised of this function at a later date.
