CHAIRPERSONS WELCOME

Welcome to the second newsletter of the year.

Last year was a difficult year for all of us. Despite all the setbacks more sharks were caught than in the previous year. There were 1311 sharks caught with 86 qualifiers and 18 porbeagles, compared with 899 with 40 qualifiers and 5 porbeagles.

We now have a catch tag and release programme for Blue Fin Tuna, I believe 15 boats have been approved for this fishery, two local boats have been approved, the Swallow11 and the Sowenna. This will give anglers an opportunity to catch these magnificent fish.

The recent Festival was a great success with 51 anglers taking part. Full details to follow. I would suggest if you wish to take part next year you contact Claire and book your place.

Despite the Covid crises the committee has been busy and have continued to meet either by Zoom or at my house (outside).

Membership continues to grow from 346 to 372 including 20 life members.

The Lucky Run Club has 16 members the lucky member wins £75 each month. If you wish to take part contact Claire.

One lucky angler had a pleasant surprise when fishing on the Bee Cool skippered by Paul Woodman, a thresher shark estimated weight 150lbs. A rare fish for these waters.

So far this year the number of sharks caught has increased from last year. 124 were caught during the Festival.

It just remains for me to thank the committee and in particular Claire Kelly for all the work and effort she puts in, Pete Davis for his work in keeping records of all the catches and Simon Thomas for his work with our data.

2021 Annual Dinner & Trophy Evening

2022 SHARK FESTIVAL

The dates have been set for the 2022 Shark Festival, 29th & 30th of June and 1st July with the draw evening taking place on the 28th June. The fee remains at £450.

To secure your space in the 2022 Festival you have two options:

- 1. Pay £100 deposit with the balance before the 28th February 2022
- 2. Pay a £75 deposit before 31st August followed by £62.50 each month starting in September and ending in February

The Booking form is available on the website. You can also pay your deposit at the SACGB shop on the website

The Festival format will be the same as this year with the points system of length + girth = points

First prize: the angler with the largest shark (in points)

Second prize: the angler with the second largest shark (in points)

Third prize: the angler with the third largest shark (in points)

Most sharks: the angler who catches the most sharks over the 3 days

Most estimated weight: the angler with the most cumulative points over the three days

Optional daily pool: The angler who catches the largest shark (in points) each day, and who has contributed to the pool, will take the money

Skipper of the boat with the largest shark (in points)

Skipper of the boat catching the most sharks over the 3 days

31 Years on!

Firstly let's go way back to the 27th June 1971, this was the day I qualified for the SACGB and here we are 50yrs later and still an active member, on committee and a skipper member to boot



The last few days have brought memories flooding back, as a man called Paul Ogden phoned me late last year and booked some days to fish with his young and very nice son Lucas.



He has just completed his 3 days and the memories must have been flooding for him also as 30 years ago his parents came to me on the "Mercia" and asked if it would be ok to send their son (14 year old) Paul out with me for a days shark fishing, I said yes of course he would be fine but on this his first and only trip he hooked,



played and brought to the boat a best of that year Blue Shark for which he won a Dutfield Tapestry (which at the time the 'club' gave to anyone catching a Blue over 130lb). Now please bear with me, back then we would bring in the fish to weigh and then it would be sold on the market to fish mongers to sell. We (the club) stopped bringing sharks in in 1996 and since then it has been strictly 'catch and release' and nowadays is the only way of monitoring shark populations for scientific research.

So, his son is following his father's footsteps (not the 130lber ©) but between them they've had 7 (and lost 1) and although the weather has not been the nicest they have fished up very well.



Lovely to re kindle friendships and feel sure it won't be 30 years till he shark fishes again.


Paul Woodman, skipper of Bee Cool caught a Thresher estimated at 150lb on 29th June.

He stated, 'it jumped three times and slack lined twice trying to escape, but was a fantastic catch!'

May Queen Skipper: Tim Newcombe

My boat is May Queen, built in Looe in 1936 by Arthur Collins.

She has a long history with lots of mentions in your (SACGB) records including the pics below.



John Kitto did very, very well with her and we have a lot to live up to. We, the Newcombe family in Cawsand, swapped our custom centre console/flats boat we built for her and we will be using her for sharking and targeting more pelagic species.



She has, before we got her, just come from a full refit including 88new ribs and 97 new planks, a new modern wheelhouse. We are planning a Scilly Isles trip and Leadertec have supplied us with some Albacore lures and we hope to get out with Peter to test some new kit in the near future. With some guidance from Simon Thomas we are developing a sling for alongside, to help with

measurements and hopefully tagging. We won't be doing charters, rather offering friends to come out and play.



The May Queen now has top of range electronics including side scan and 360 scan as well as bottom definition and maxsea plotter with a 35mm radar and 2 class A VHFS and AIS receiver along with 12 man life raft.



I have been fishing with dad since i was knee high to a grass hopper and I'm no stranger to the sea. Shark fishing is very new to me and I would like to thank all those that have given me advice etc, I won't name them as i may forget someone but they know who they are!

We really look forward to supporting the SACGB with conservation and protecting the sport with the Best Practise Document.

A touch screen display has been provided to the Sardine Factory Heritage Centre in West Looe by ourselves and Angling Heritage UK to show the history of shark fishing through a slideshow of photographs taken over the years. This is also available on the SACGB Website.
