CHAIRPERSONS WELCOME

Welcome to the second newsletter of the year.

I am pleased to report that more sharks have been caught last season than the season before. 1231 sharks in total were caught, 144 of these were qualifiers and there were 2 Porbeagles and 2 Threshers caught. This is slightly less than the previous season but the number of qualifiers has increased with the bonus of the Porbeagles and Threshers. Hopefully this trend for larger fish will continue. I believe that the water temperature is higher this year and the number of fish caught in June has been the most recorded for many years. We hope that this continues.

Membership has now reached 400 members including 20 life members and the level of activity on Facebook and our website continues to increase.

Our Lucky Run Club has 15 paying members, which is surprising considering the amount of

members we now have, the winner each month receiving £70.

I am pleased to announce that the catch, tag and release programme for Bluefin Tuna will continue. Two local boats have, once again, been approved for this. These are the Swallow and the Sowenna.

With the sad loss of Paul Martin we are in need of new Committee members, with two places available, please speak to myself or Claire if you are interested. And remember that you do not have to be local to Looe to do this as all of our meetings are accessible via Zoom.

The Committee, this year, decided to offer 'Full Skipper Memberships' to enable skippers who don't usually get a chance to fish to have the benefit of membership. Six skippers have been invited so far and have all taken up the offer. This is by invitation only from the Committee if the skipper is actively promoting the Club and its Best Practice.

Dates for next year's Festival are 5th, 6th & 7th July so book early to avoid being disappointed. Unfortunately we cannot, at this time, give you a price for the Festival as the cost of fuel still rises!

Finally, I would like to thank the Committee for attending meetings in what has been a difficult year.

2023 SHARK FESTIVAL

The dates have been set for the 2023 Shark Festival, 5th, 6th & 7th July with the draw evening taking place on the 4th June. The fee to be confirmed.

To secure your space in the 2023 Festival you have two options:

- Pay £100 deposit with the balance before the 28th February 2023
- Pay a £100 deposit before 31st August followed by £tbc each month starting in September and ending in February

The Booking form is available on the website. You can also pay your deposit at the SACGB shop on the website

The Festival format will be the same as this year with the points system of length + girth = points

First prize: the angler with the largest shark (in points)

Second prize: the angler with the second largest shark (in points)

Third prize: the angler with the third largest shark (in points)

Most sharks: the angler who catches the most sharks over the 3 days

Most estimated weight: the angler with the most cumulative points over the three days

Optional daily pool: The angler who catches the largest shark (in points) each day, and who has contributed to the pool, will take the money

Skipper of the boat with the largest shark (in points)

Skipper of the boat catching the most sharks over the 3 days

Please book early to avoid disappointment.

CLOTHING & MERCHANDISE

Don't forget you can order your Mugs, Badges, T Shirts, Hoodies and Sweatshirts from the website.



We have maintained the clothing pricing, again, this year with Hoodies at £25 plus postage, Sweatshirts at £20 plus postage, Polo Shirts at £15 plus postage, T Shirts at £10 plus postage and Baseball caps at £10 plus postage.

Stocks of the large type 120" measuring tape, are available at £21 plus postage.

The large type on these tapes increases the clarity of video and photographic measurement evidence and they have already been used to good effect by many of our members. Onwards and upwards for the Pat Smith Database

As many of you will be aware, earlier this year the Shark Trust, along with a number of other similar organisations, submitted a proposal to the Joint Nature and Conservation Committee (JNCC) to to add Porbeagle to Schedule 5 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act

At time of writing we are unaware of the JNCC's decision but if they uphold the proposal, recreational sea angling for Porbeagle shark will be banned.

Unlike the MMO, the Wildlife and Countryside Act has significant powers including the ability to prosecute and seize assets so the Act has teeth.

The response from the recreational sea angling sector to the proposal was impressive on two levels. The first was that we were able to respond on a factual basis using data analysis from the recreational sea angler Porbeagle catch data held in the Pat Smith Database.

Organisations such as ICCAT, ICES and the IUCN publicly recognise the high quality of recreational sea angling data so it is important we continue to use this platform to demonstrate our significant contribution to the conservation of sharks.

The second was how the various organisations came together to challenge the proposal. These included the SACGB, Angling Trust, Shark Hub, Sportfishing Club of the British Isles and the Professional Boatman's Association.

To date the Pat Smith Database has been developed and managed by Dr. Simon Thomas (SACGB Honorary Scientist) and John McMaster and with it now comprising over 100,000 records, spread over a time line from the 1950's to present day, the time has come to move to the next stage.

The vision Simon and John share is to convert the Pat Smith Database into a charitable organisation. This would enable them to apply for funding to do more projects and better position recreational sea angling whilst improving our knowledge of these magnificent predators. A few weeks back Pat Smiths son Dave's met John McMaster in Looe where they were able to discuss the type of work the Pat Smith Database Charity would seek to do and Dave very kindly agreed to having his mothers name associated with the charity. Pat was unable to make the family trip to Looe this time but she continues to be in good health and still loves to talk about the many memories she has of her sharking trips in Looe.
